SISHK Class of 2024: Celebrates Outstanding IBDP Results and Univer- sity Offers

The 2024 cohort of graduates performed exceptionally in the May IBDP examinations this year. They achieved a 100% pass rate and a remarkable average score of 38.9 points, which is well above the world average of 30. Out of the twenty-nine students that were awarded above 40 points, three students achieved the perfect score of 45.

With the college application season concluded as well, SISHK is proud to announce the university acceptance results for the class of 2024. Among the fifty-four graduates, they have achieved an impressive average of 4.7 offers per student.

The cohort received numerous offers from prestigious universities such as Yale University, University of Oxford, University of Chicago, and more.

We had the opportunity to hear from two stellar graduates from the SISHK graduating class of 2024, Leo Zhou and Lisa Tsoi, on their thoughts and feelings as they transition to university and beyond.

Leo Zhou

Born in Beijing and having moved to Hong Kong in 2016, Leo had been a dedicated student at SISHK for the past eight years. His passion for public speaking and debate has led him to achieve numerous accolades, including top placements in both Mandarin and English competitions, as well as several Best Debater Awards. Having achieved a perfect IB score, Leo received offers from the University of Hong Kong, University of Toronto, Manchester University, Imperial College London, and the University of Oxford.



What are some of the most memorable moments during your time at SISHK? How has SISHK supported you in your academic and personal growth?

Having extra lessons in IGCSE to prepare for Additional Mathematics where I sometimes stayed until 5 p.m. with the class. I think the school teaching environment is very supportive and engages students very well academically.

In terms of personal growth, I learned a lot through being involved in the Student Council as well as the Chinese Culture Connection. I appreciate all the leadership opportunities the school provides that allows for holistic growth.

Lisa Tsoi

Having spent 14 years at SISHK, Lisa Tsoi considers it to be her second home. Her outstanding academic achievements include being the International Winner of the Unsung Heroes of Science Competition, as well as a recipient of the Outstanding Cambridge Learner Awards for Top in World for Additional Mathematics and Top in Hong Kong for Biology. Beyond her academic success, Lisa is actively involved in extracurricular activities, notably serving as co-president of the Muzé Committee. Lisa holds offers from University of Oxford, University of Hong Kong, University of Edinburgh, and University of Toronto.



What are some of your most memorable moments during your time at SISHK? How has SISHK supported you in your academic and personal growth?

We can probably all agree that the main driving factor for our academic growth would be our teachers! Our teachers are extremely willing to listen to our thoughts or doubts in class, review an overwhelming number of

An NUS seminar was held at the 7/F Auditorium to encourage senior students to consider the National University of Singapore for their higher education. The

talk began with a video from Boey Jun Xin, an SISHK '23 alumna now studying at the National University of Singapore, who shared about her university life there. The university representative, Ms. Eunice Chew, then elaborated on the unique opportunities available at NUS. In her speech, she highlighted the university's strong academic curriculum, vibrant campus life, international exchange programs with numerous universities such as the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), and its extensive career support and abundant job opportunities that help graduates secure positions in top industries around the world.

They visited various temples, learning of the polytheistic religions that characterised the vivacity and novelty of the region; enjoying negotiations at street markets, and most memorably visited the Cu Chi Tunnels and the War Remnants Museum. They also were exposed to hands-on experiences like pottery-making, cooking traditional Vietnamese dishes, and rice planting.
